them as to which of them was considered to be greatest. ²⁵ Jesus said to them, "The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who exercise authority over them call themselves Benefactors. ²⁶ But you are not to be like that. Instead, the greatest among you should be like the youngest, and the one who rules like the one who serves. ²⁷ For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one who is at the table? But I am among you as one who serves.

People always tend to think about **competition**! Maybe about achievements, savings, academics, anything could be used as the topic of competition. But then Jesus told them one of **the greatest contradiction** of His teaching: **the greatest is the one who serves**! Even Jesus showed Himself as a servant in the presence of His disciples. At the peak of His ministry, at the last night before He went to the cross, Jesus literally humbled Himself and wash the feet of the disciples as a very lowly servant!
